VIII. PUBLIC HEARING FOR PROPOSED RULE AMENDMENT(S):

- A. Discussion and action on proposed amendments to liquor administrative rule § 08-101-30 Application, of the Rules Governing the Manufacture and Sale of Intoxicating Liquor of the County of Maui. The proposed rule amendments seek to streamline the application process and better align documentation requirements with the Hawai'i Revised Statutes. These changes are intended to reduce administrative delays, eliminate duplicative requirements already covered by other county and state agencies, improve clarity for applicants, and address staffing constraints that impact application processing.
- B. Discussion and action on a proposed amendment to liquor administrative rule § 08-101-61 Minors, of the Rules Governing the Manufacture and Sale of Intoxicating Liquor of the County of Maui. The proposed rule amendment seek to improve regulatory efficiency and effectiveness and ensure a balanced approach that protects public health and safety while allowing businesses to responsibly utilize common industry practices. For example, to align with State law updated in 2018, the Commission plans to add subsection (f)(4) to allow a licensee operating under a Class 14 (brewpub) or Class 18 (small craft producer pub) license to allow minors who are accompanied by a parent or legal guardian of legal drinking age on the licensee's premises.

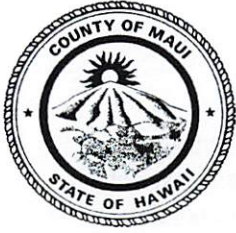
