## Meeting Minutes

October 13, 2020

### 1. **Announcements**

Andrew Hawickhorst called the meeting

Leonard Strickland of Verizon 5G was asked to visit and was first to speak. He clarified the 5' orange/white poles on Cold Spring were actually not for 5G specifically, but fiber optic lines. He also took the addresses who had the poles in their front yard and indicated he had an associate who would be able to help in having the poles replaced with plates. This seems like a great solution of it is done. He also indicated that the time 5G does come out, they do what they can to attach their equipment to existing light poles, and if so, then start covering the cost and maintenance of those lights (10 yr LED lights). They will list an 800# on each pole in case of any issues. At this point, no plans to deploy 5G coverage in Wynnedale in 2020 or 2021.

Approval of Minutes

Treasurer's report from Jarnell

\$4500 saved from eliminating Elite Security contract will be reallocated to General Fund. Next steps are to gather further information on cost associated w/ new lighting on the northside of town. Sue also collecting information the cost to repair the light that ideally is put into Sleepy Hollow in replace of the current tall light at that location.

Jarnell was settling the outstanding bill with CMT

### 2. **Unfinished Business**

Ann has been in conversation with IDPW and they indicated it is unlikely to have speed bumps installed on Cold Spring. Someone mentioned potentially rumble strips which Ann is following up on. Ann also has messages out with IMPD about signage or an officer to catch speeders.

Josh followed up on Litz property, exploring the idea of if we could consider a civil suit from the town citing decrease in property values.

Sue is checking on course of action regarding the tree on Mr. Johnson's property on Roland Rd....whether it is something that HAS to be removed and who would actually enforce the tree removal.

3. **Open Discussion**

Sue was asking for clarity on terminology to be used with regards to geographic locations of Wynnedale. Is this a council issue needing discussed or a preference of citizens that isn't a matter for town council?

Parking on the esplanade...even if it was a decision controlled by council, council doesn't see an issue with it as the sprinklers are all located in the beds and it seems the esplanade is a right of way.
