Mayor Troy Painter called the work session to order at 6:04 pm.

- Mona City Celebration  
Councilmember Newton stated that she would like to begin discussing ideas for the 2026 Mona City Celebration. She presented the Council with a list outlining the activities held in 2025, along with proposed ideas for 2026. She also asked the Council to consider expanding the celebration to include Thursday evening. Further discussion followed regarding potential activities and the structure of sponsorships.
- Hiring for Green Waste Site and Ball Fields  
Councilmember Newton stated that Recreation Director Myller De Araujo gave his resignation.

There was discussion about the Green Waste Site and the possibility of hiring an employee to maintain the facility. The Council questioned whether the budget would allow for this position and agreed to look into the budget.

- CivicLinQ platform for Mona City Code  
Recorder Hills stated that she has reviewed the CivicLinQ platform and would like to switch over. She stated that the cost is significantly cheaper and that it is similar to use. The Council agreed to approve switching to CivicLinQ and paying the \$1,000 to have the code transferred from the old platform of Civic Plus to CivicLinQ.



- Sewer Impact Fee Increase  
Mayor Painter stated that the sewer plant needs more funding and this may be a way to help with maintenance. Finance Director Steele stated that the fee is currently at \$5500 per ERC, and the suggestion was to raise it to \$6,454.00. It was decided to hold a public hearing and propose changes to the fee schedule at the next City meeting.
- 200 North Cost Increase  
Mayor Painter reported that he has been in discussions with the County regarding the widening of the lane on 200 North. As part of the project, a fire hydrant will need to be relocated, and the City plans to install four valves during the excavation to improve isolation capabilities during emergencies. The additional cost will be covered by the General Fund, and an item will be placed on the City Council agenda proposing approval of up to \$45,000 for the project.
- Budget
