1. Approval of the Stormwater Management Minutes for the week of March 11, 2025.
2. Approval of Resolution #112-3-25-25-1, Allowing Permanent Structure in Legal Drain Right-of-Way at 5749 Meadowbrook Dr. - Arnold PB Drain.
3. Approval of Resolution #112-3-25-25-2, Allowing Permanent Structure in Legal Drain Right-of-Way at 5511 North Brookwood Dr. (Schoppman Drain).
4. Approval of Professional Services Agreement between the City of Fort Wayne and Northastrum Engineering for Regulatory Educational Programs Assistance for City Utilities for Year 2025. Compensation for services performed shall not exceed \$39,910.00.
5. Approval of Professional Services Agreement between the City of Fort Wayne and A&Z Engineering for on-call construction site stormwater run-off inspection services. Compensation for services performed shall not exceed \$90,000.00.
6. Approval of Contract #2024-ST-0545, 4901 Vance Ave between the City of Fort Wayne Board of Stormwater Management and Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation to construct a local storm drainage system. This project is privately funded and located inside the city. Contract value is \$50,422.00.
7. Approval of recommendation from City Utilities Engineering to award Resolution #83819, Wallen Rd and Village Dr Stormwater Improvements to Exterior Service in the amount of \$335,880.00.
8. Approval of Change Order #1 & Final between the City of Fort Wayne and Heartland Restoration Services and acceptance of the work performed for Contract #83930, Rain Gardens Renovation 2023, upon the recommendation of City Utilities Engineering. The final change order decreases the original contract price by \$6,191.08 to a final contract price of \$43,412.05.
9. Acceptance of the work performed by Witwer Construction for Contract# 2020-ST-0271, 880 Grand National Drive-Illinois Crossing Phase II upon the recommendation from City Utilities Engineering as an integral part of the City's sanitary sewer system.
