

Wynnedale Town Council

June 14, 2022 minutes

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Present were Mary Beth Schneider, Ann Hildner, Sue Rice, Josh Smith, Andy Hawickhorst and Clerk-Treasurer Jarnell Burks-Craig.

Neighbors attending were Kirstie Andersen Schmoll, Tammy Callahan and Joan SerVaas.

Minutes from last meeting were approved.

Jarnell Burks-Craig gave the treasurer's report. Our balance in checking is \$9,893.39 and the Money Market Account has \$135,029.24. Also discussed was the ARP (American Rescue Plan) funds of \$ 27,815.74 which is half the total amount to be received over a two year period. She is still gathering information on whether the town will be able to keep the funds and what uses qualify.

There was discussion of the gravel path in the Bird Sanctuary. It is unfinished at this time and Ann Hildner was going to check into the progress.

A discussion of Wynnedale remaining an Incorporated Town was discussed. At this time Jarnell-Burks Craig gave a summary of the finances, budget and the procedure of reporting. The fear of Knollton Road being opened if we relinquished our town incorporated status was of major concern.

Joan SerVaas mentioned since we were possibly one of the smallest incorporated towns in the state that most of the rules and regulations seem to apply to larger towns. It was suggested we obtain legal advice.

Various ways of announcing the date and time of meetings were discussed. Using the town email list which Bruce Ranger has

assembled was a suggestion or posting this information on reusable signs around Wynnedale entrances. These dates and times are posted on the [www.Wynnedale.org](http://www.Wynnedale.org) site and by law we must post this information but many do not use this site on a regular basis.

Speeding on Wynnedale streets was discussed and it was decided that Andy Hawickhorst and Josh Smith will do a door-to-door survey of installing speed bumps. We have not researched the installation cost, damage to the streets or type of bumps (there are several choices). It was noted in the meeting that even residents do not always follow the 25 mph speed limits.

There will be no Wynnedale Town Council meeting in July.

The next meeting will be August 9, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. at the Fitness Farm.
