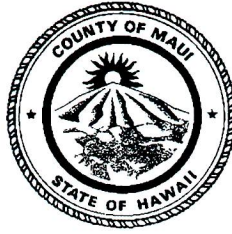

ORAL TESTIMONY: Testimony will be taken at the beginning of the meeting and when each item is discussed. Testifiers may only testify once per item. Oral testifiers are afforded three (3) minutes to testify per agenda item. Testifiers are asked to mute their audio and video when they are not testifying.

Testifiers via video may sign-up to testify by sending a Direct Message in the Chat function to the Commission Secretary, signifying their intention to testify and noting the agenda item number. Testimony shall not be submitted within the Chat function, and the Chat function may not be used to contact Commissioners, or other meeting participants, for commenting on the agenda items, or other matters. Individuals may be disconnected from the meeting for breaking decorum.

Testifiers via phone will be called after video testimony has concluded.

WRITTEN TESTIMONY: Whether sent via fax, email, or USPS, written testimony should be received by the Maui Police Commission by noon, two business days before the meeting to ensure distribution to the Commissioners. Testimony submitted after this time will still be accepted by the Commission.
