

The Alvin Senior Citizens Board
Meeting Minutes
February 9, 2026

1. Call to Order – Meeting was called to order at 9:06am.
2. Roll Call – All Board Members present. Michelle Nesrsta, Parks & Recreation Superintendent, and Marla Grigsby, Manager Senior Center, present.
3. Approval of Minutes for January 12, 2026 – Member Green made a motion to approve the minutes. Member Hockin seconded the motion. All members present approved the minutes.
4. Petitions/Requests from the Public – None
5. Board Chair Report –
 - a. Chair Burkey thanked Member Green for getting the war memorial and bench moved to the Senior Center. Chair Burkey apologized for missing the last meeting. His wife had surgery and she is doing well.
6. Recreation Superintendent Report –
 - a. The original company working on the east end door kept ordering the incorrect parts. The city has changed companies and the door is fixed now. Need to confirm the east end door is working. The switch may not be flipped. Superintendent Nesrsta will check to see if the outlet in the west end has been repaired.
 - b. The air conditioner at the Rec Center is not working. Summer registration starts on April 13.
7. Senior Center Manager Report –
 - a. The Mardi Gras luncheon is February 12 and the Go Texan luncheon is February 27. Both events have over 50 people registered.
 - b. The traffic on Hood Street will be switched tomorrow, February 10. It was suggested a map be drawn to show how to use the alley by the dumpster to park in the back. It cannot be required for people to park at Stanton's. All trips can be changed to leave and return from Stanton's. The painting of the Senior Center begins today, February 9. It will take approximately 2 weeks. The oil painting on the doors, frames and chair rails will be done on the weekend due to the odor.
 - c. The Senior Center will be closed on February 16. The March/April newsletter will be out February 23. Sign up will begin March 2.

8. New Business –
 - a. Member Ansley suggested stained ceiling tiles be replaced and the A/C vents be cleaned for the budget. Superintendent Nesrsta said these could be done with a work order.
 - b. It was asked if the Senior Center could provide coffee to Actions. There is an account, High Steppers, that Actions may be able to use.
9. Items of Community Interest –
 - a. Chair Burkey – The State of the State address will be tomorrow, February 10, at the Nolan Ryan Center at 11:00am. Jeff Barry and Randy Weber will be speaking. A ticket may be needed. Chair Burkey will check. The Museum quarterly membership meeting will be on February 15 at 2:00pm. The events from the last quarter and future events will be discussed. The CAP meeting will be on February 23 from 5:00 – 7:00pm at the Nolan Ryan Center. March 9 will be the next Senior Board meeting and Coffee with Cops at the skating rink.
 - b. Member Green – The open area by the flag and war memorial used to have table. Would it be possible to get another table. There is a table outside the exercise room that could be moved. Dick Tyson passed away on February 1. He was homeless by choice and used to be on the City Council.
 - c. Member Shepherd – Inquired on when Gordon Street construction will be completed. There is a post on FaceBook by Ashley Davis stating that the work must be coordinated with the railroad. On April 30 there will be a dinner and dance for the Gathering Place. It will be held at the Knights of Columbus Hall from 6:00 – 9:00pm. Tickets are \$40.
 - d. Member Hockin – Member Hockin and his wife, Dora, visited T.L. He was awake, his hands were not blue, and he talked coherently. T.L.'s wife said his heart was working at 20% and his organs were failing. She was going to put in a DNR and place him in hospice. He was on oxygen in the ICU at St. Luke's.
