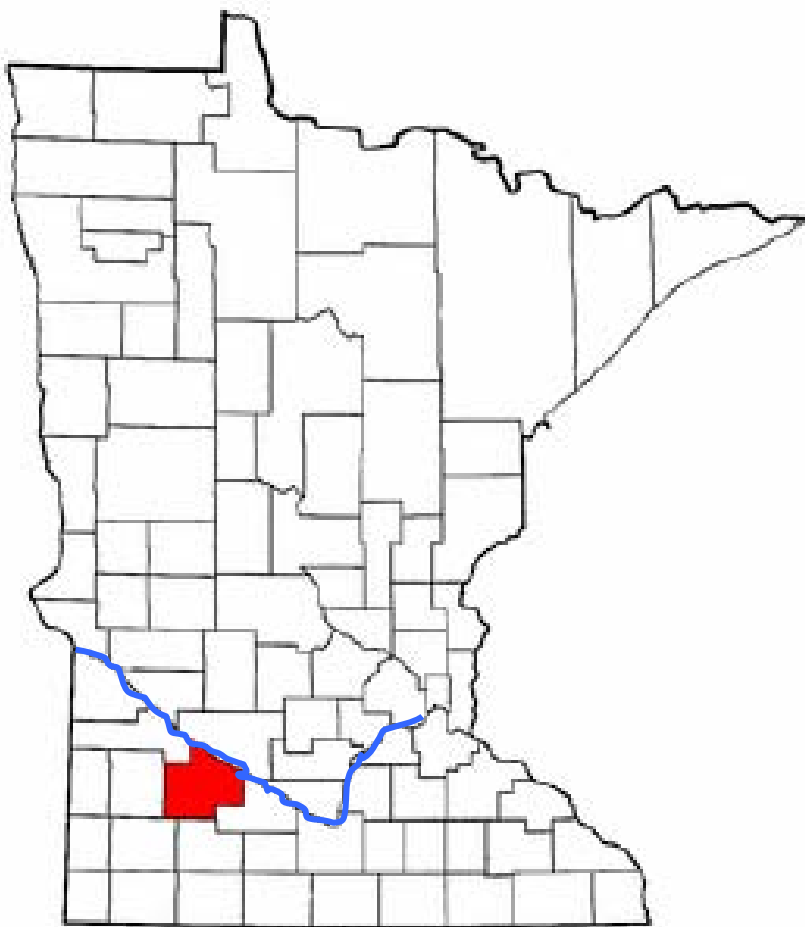

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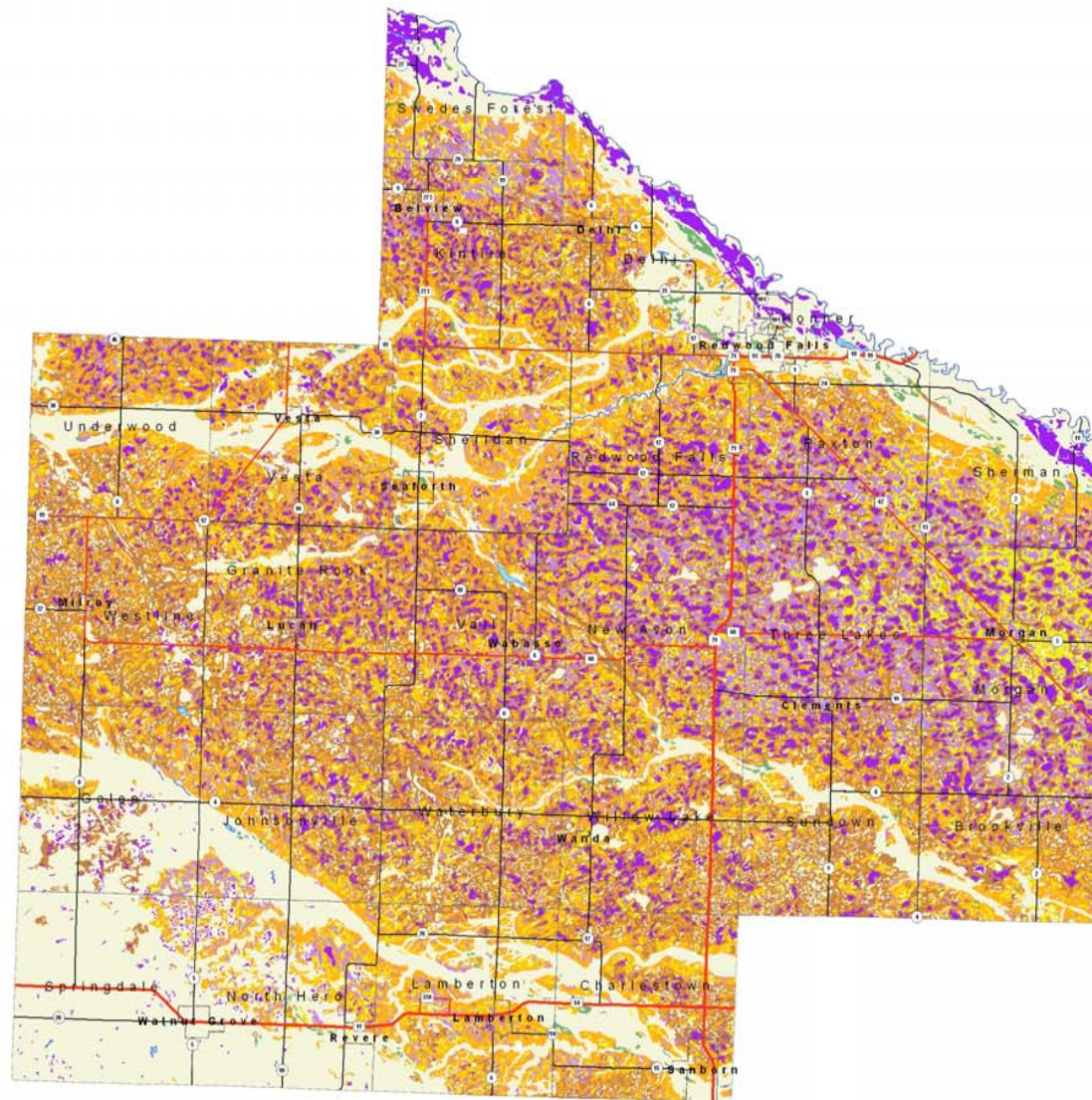

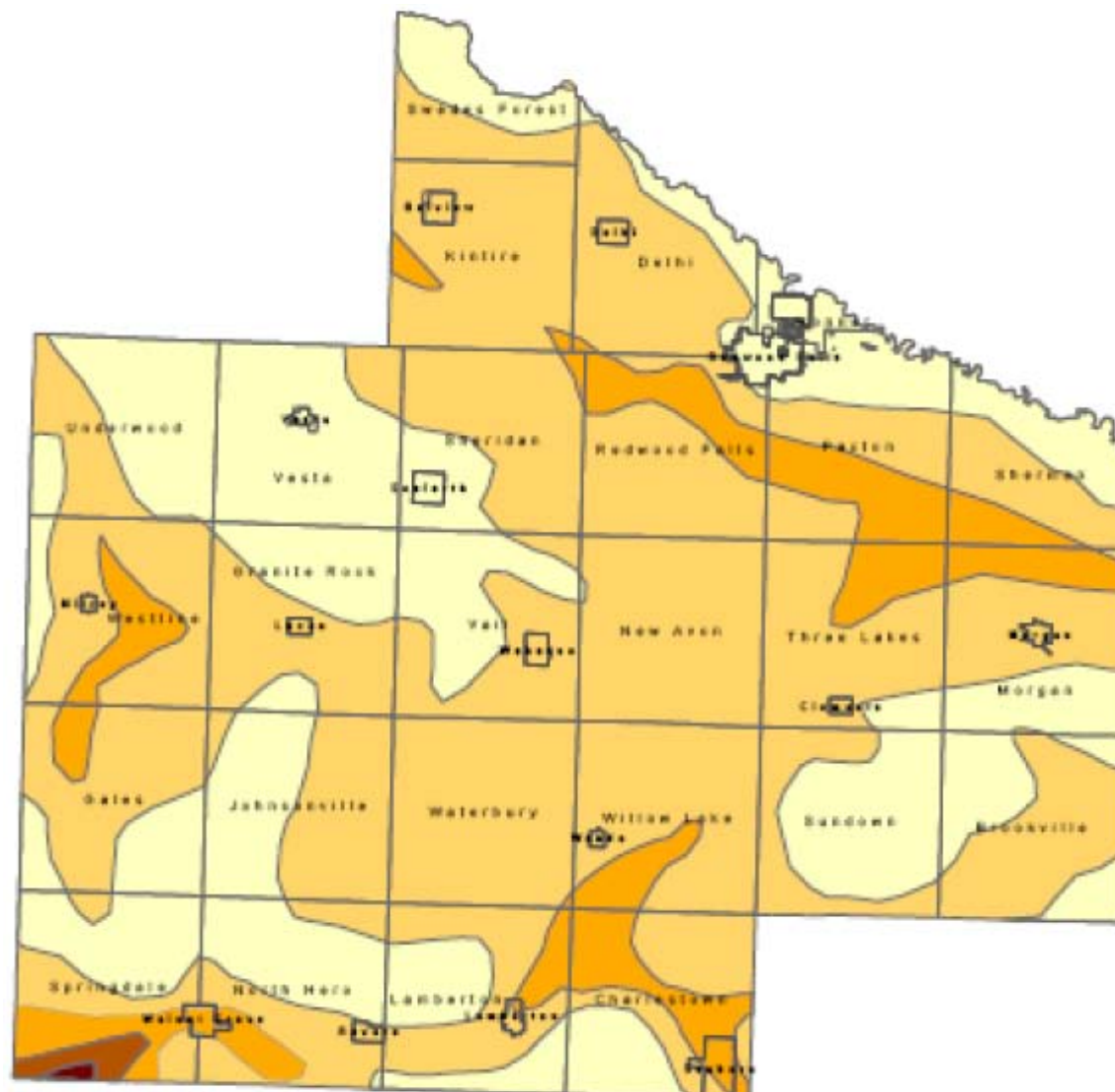

Redwood County Steep Slopes

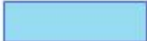


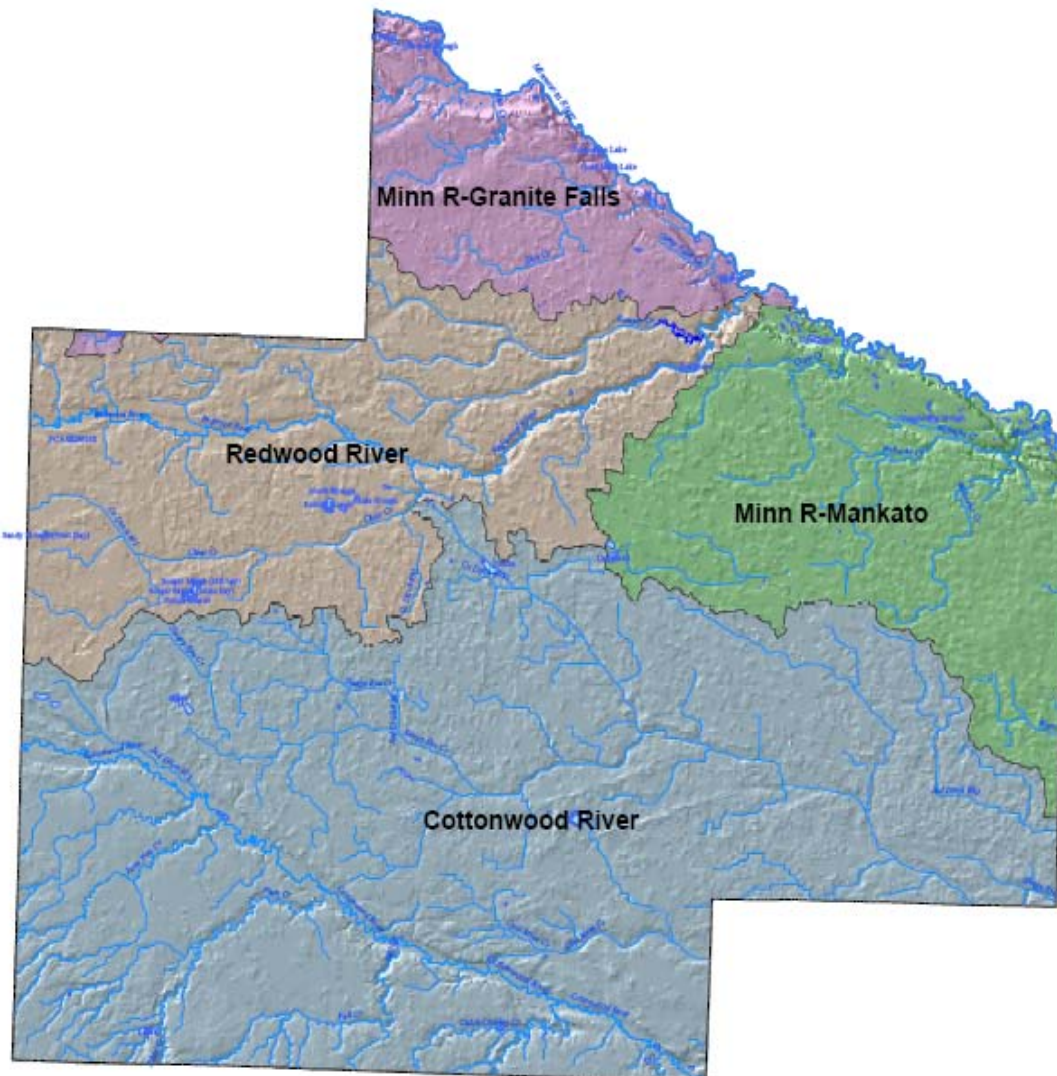

Redwood County Rivers, Creeks and Streams



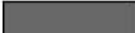

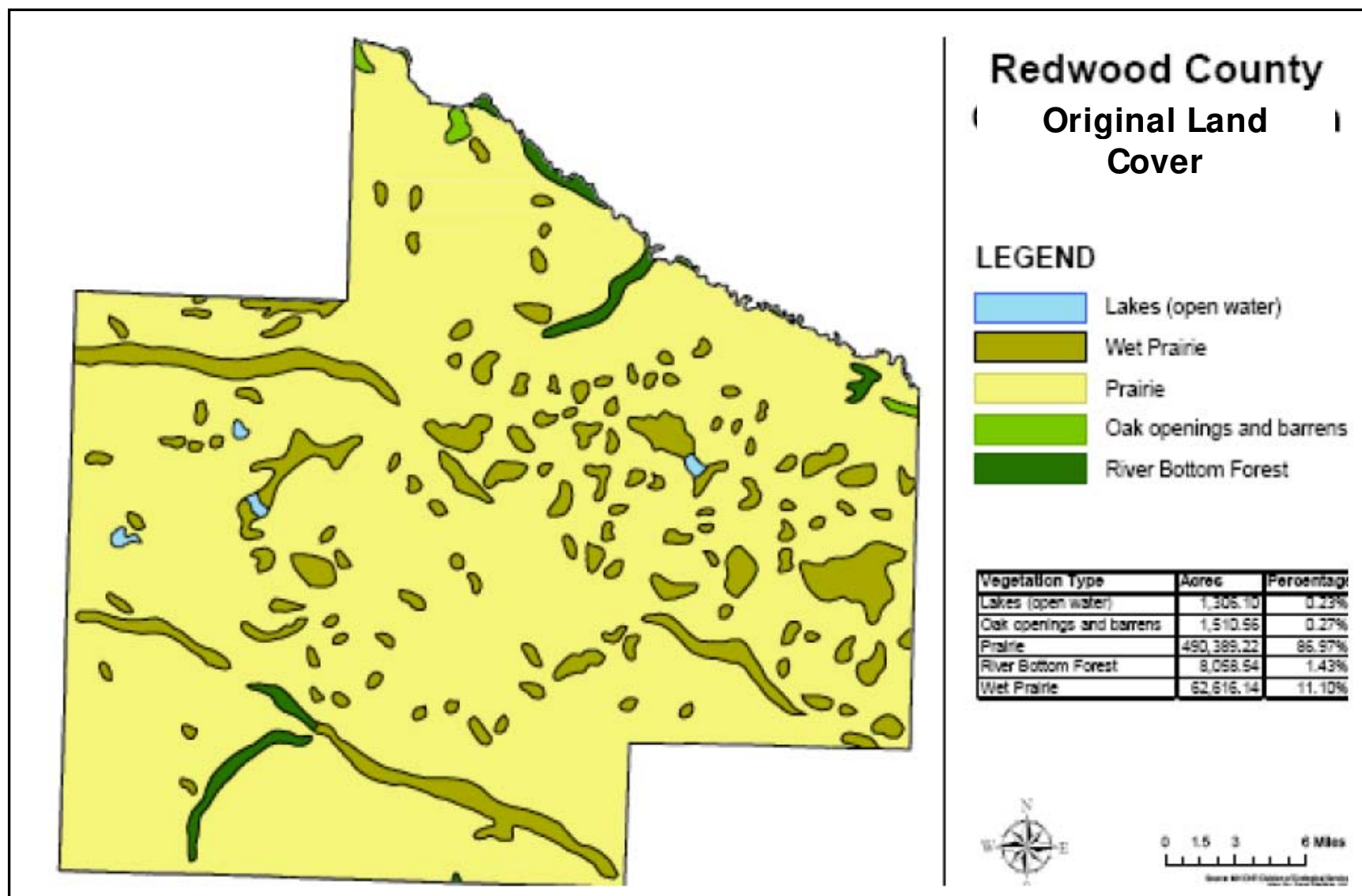

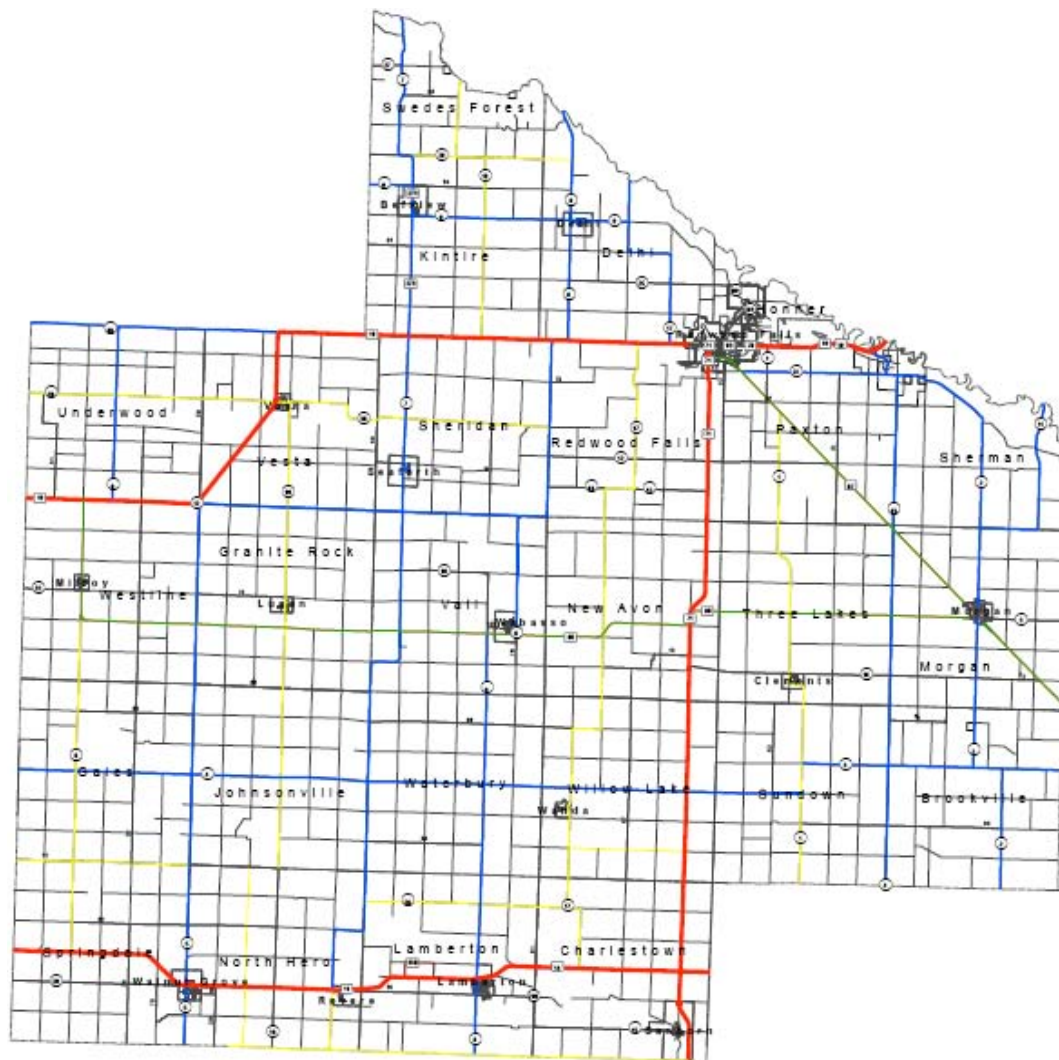

Redwood County Current Functional Classification



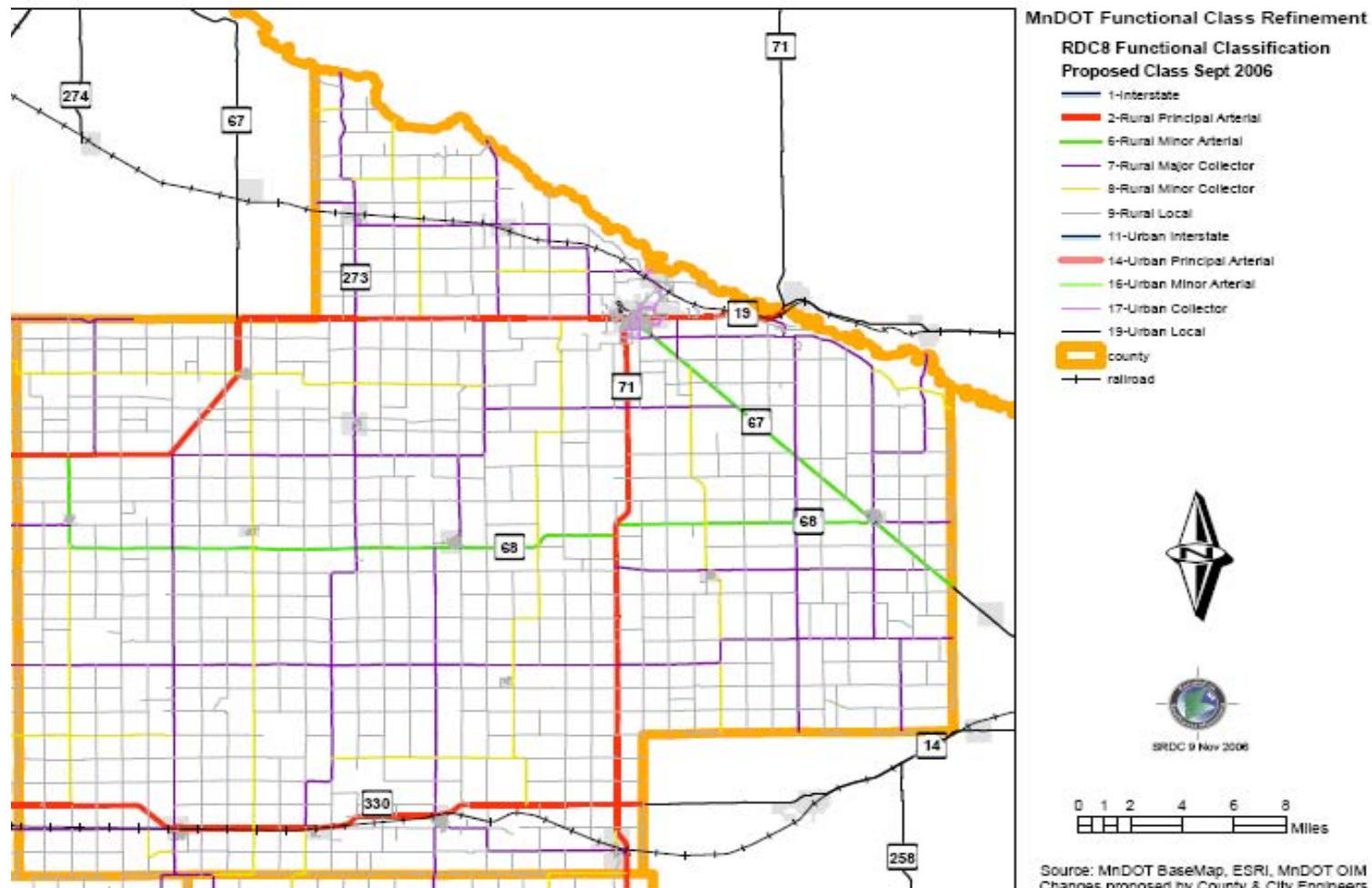
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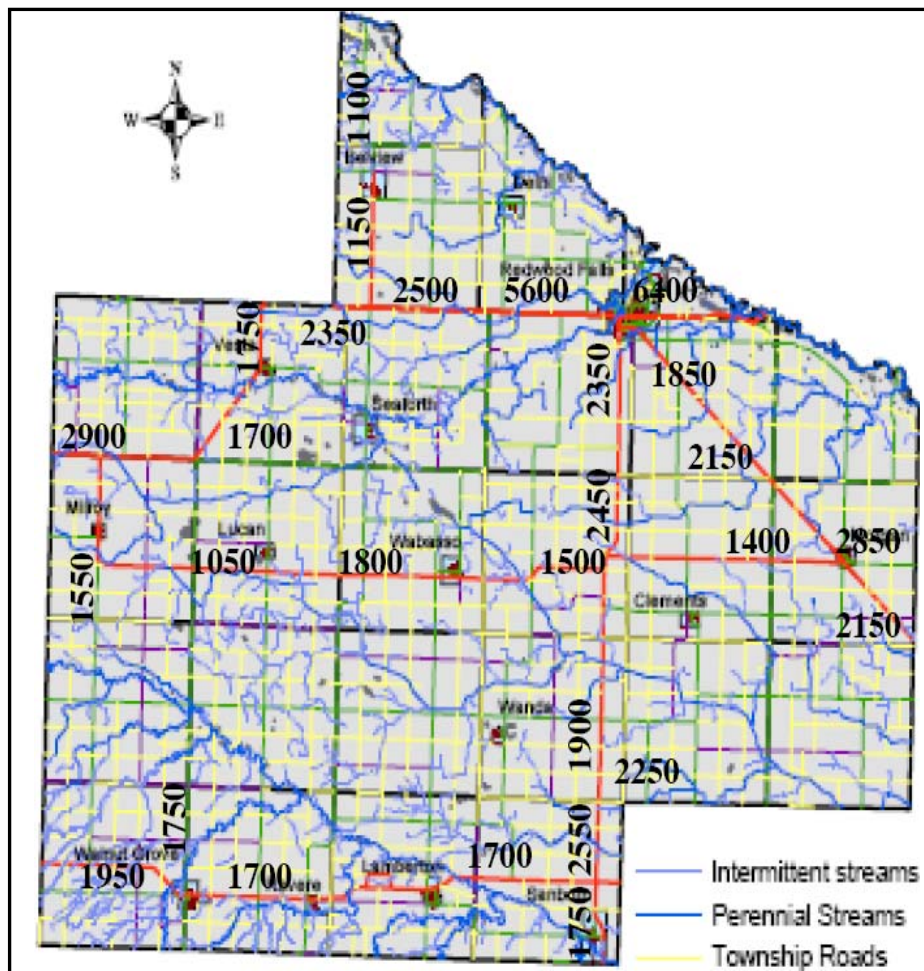

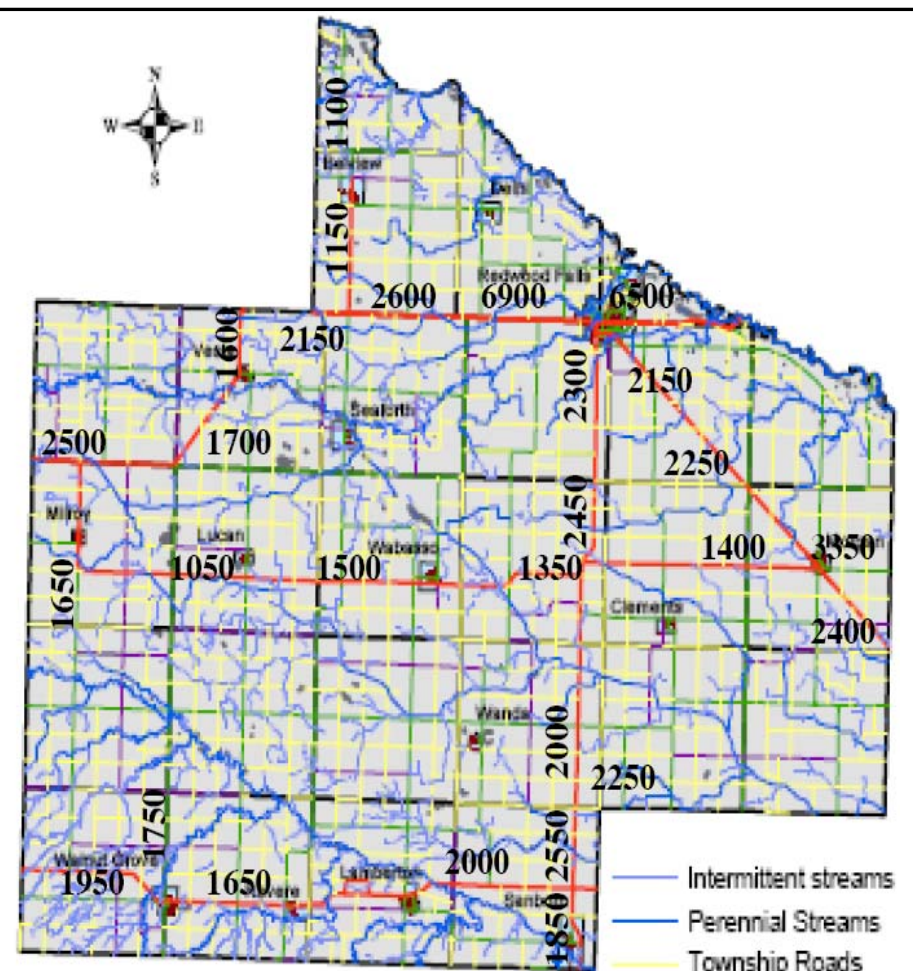

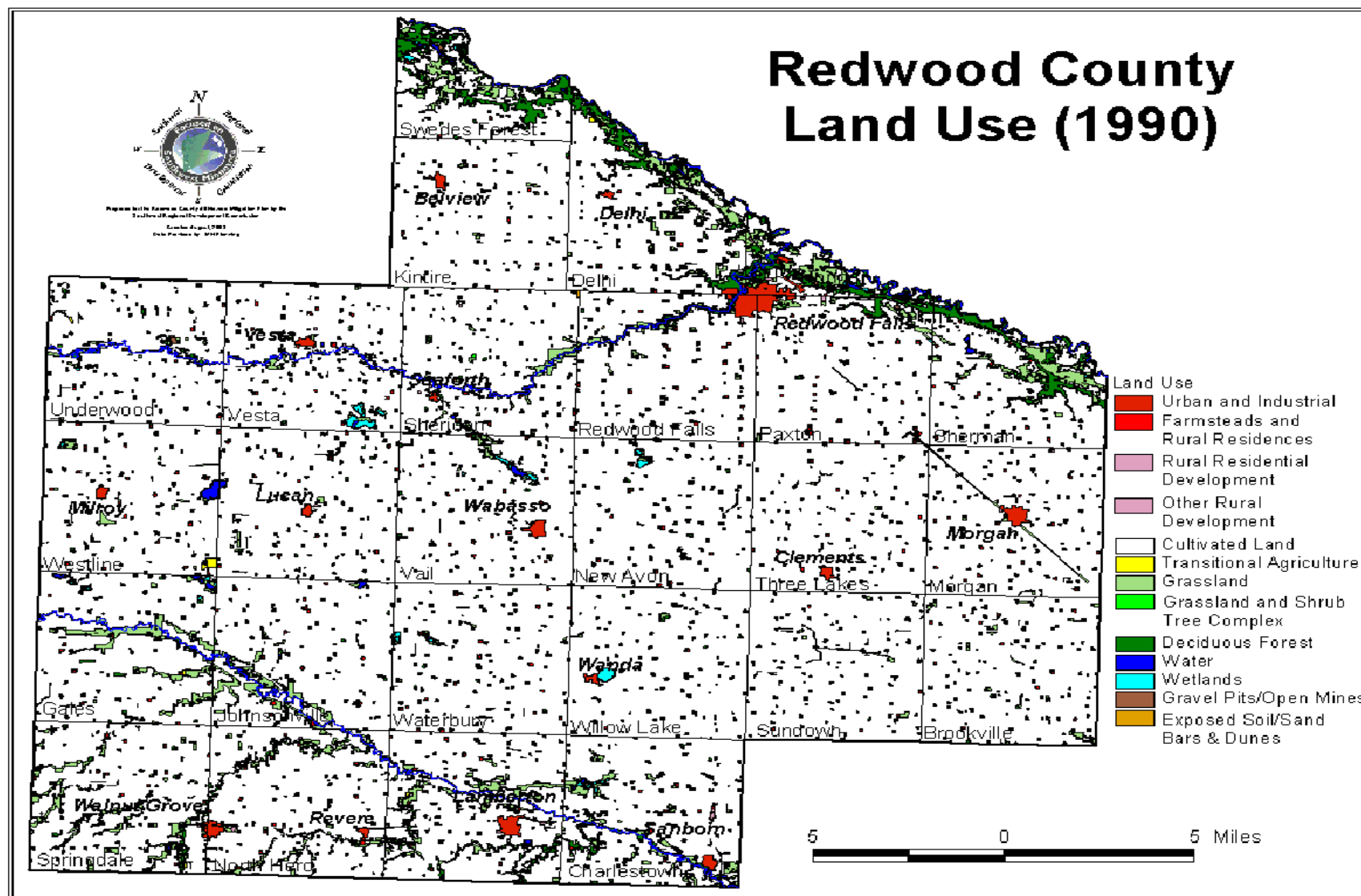




2000 Average Daily Traffic

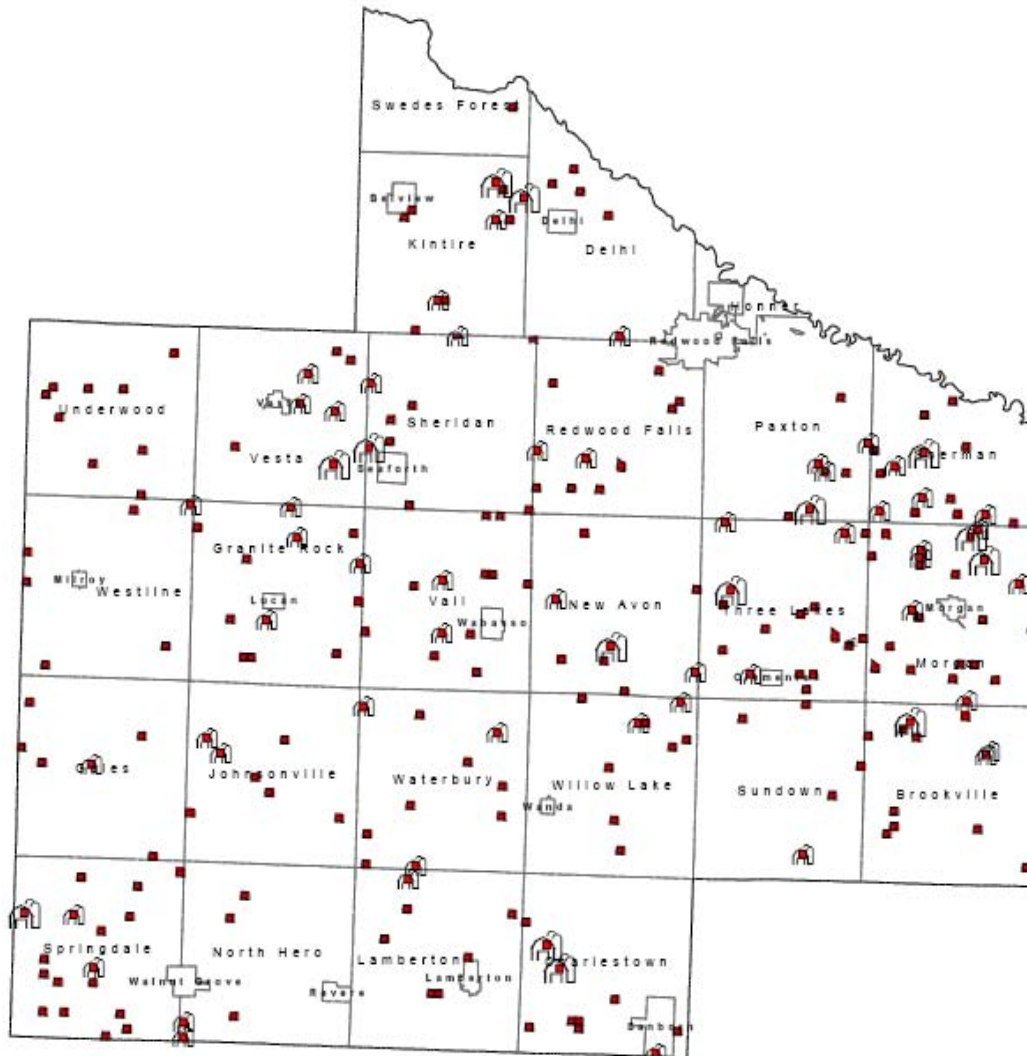
Redwood County Known Feedlots & Total Animal Units

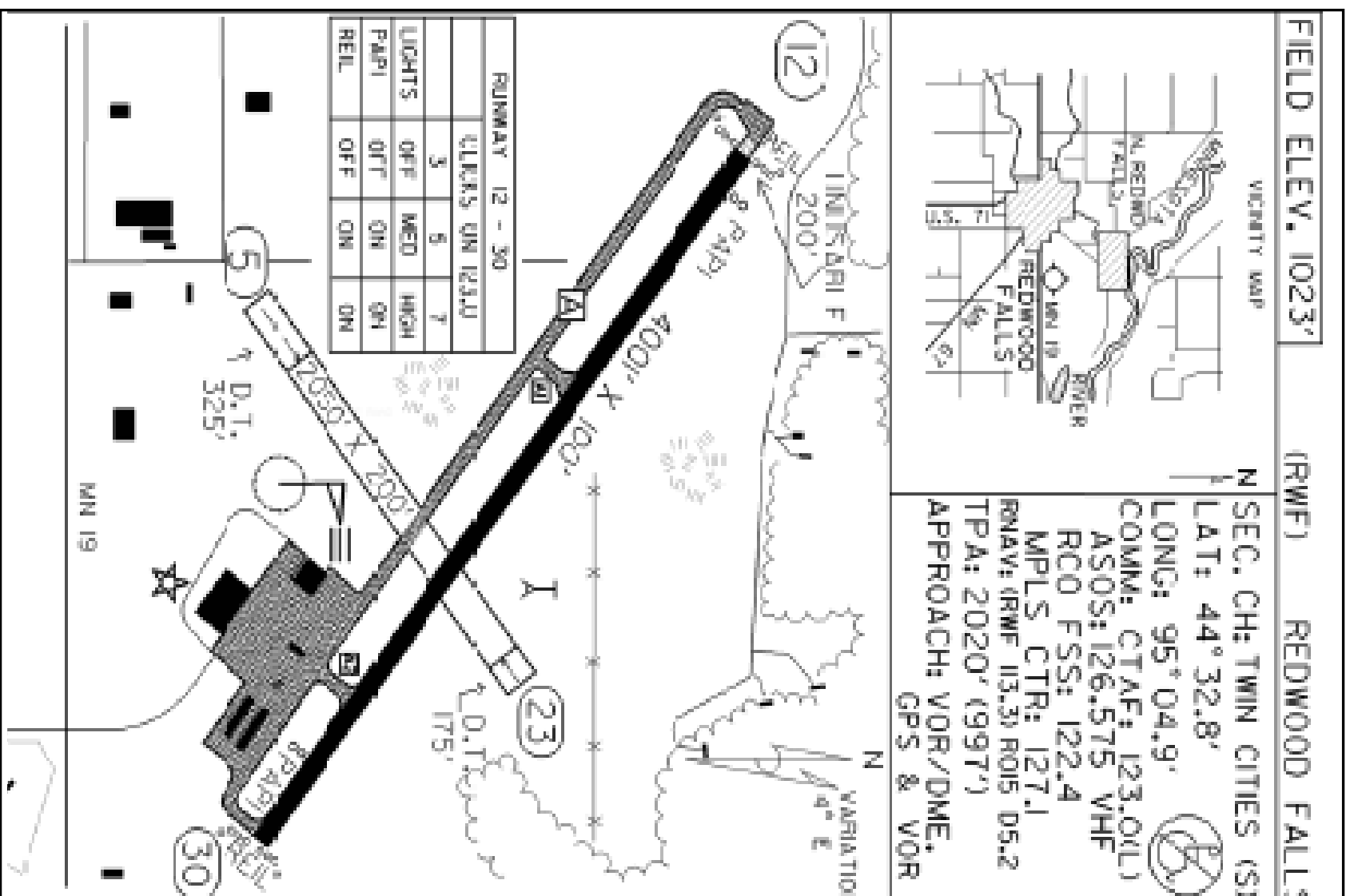

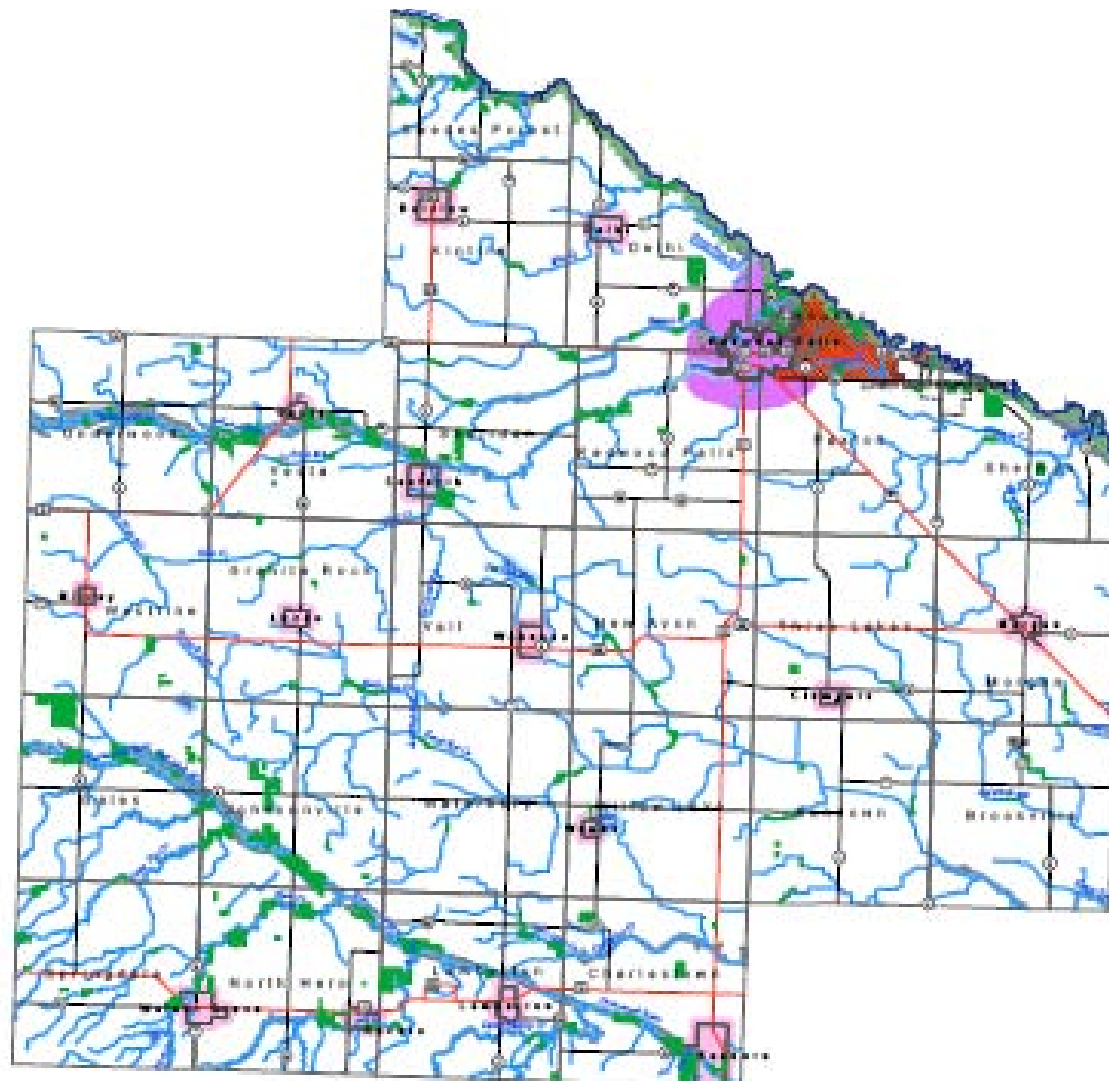

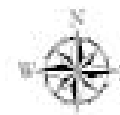


Redwood County Landscape and Land Use Zones and Conservation Land Areas
