**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

2/6/26: Poisoned Deceased Cat follow up

Person #1 ACO Valandingham Liberty Street

Out of concern for the safety of the cats/wildlife in the area, in regards to the possible poisoning, I patrolled the area of Liberty Street. I would like to keep my presence known in hopes no foul play will occur.

2/6/26: Poisoned Deceased Cat follow up

Person #1 Green Street; Liberty

Person #2 ACO Valandingham

I reached out to Person #1 for an update on the cats in the above area. Someone may be intentionally injuring cats and/or poisoning them. I am attempting to get proof in order to get the travesty to stop. It is illegal and inhumane to treat any animal this way. Possibly, one cat is in need of medical attention; possible leg injury/shot.

2/11/26: Injured Cat

Person #1 ACO Valandingham Green Street

I had received information of a cat with a leg injury. The injury is unknown. I arrived to Green Street and patrolled the area in search for the cat. UTL.

2/16/26: Invoice review

I had received the invoices from Animal Hospital. I reviewed them and found some error and passed the information along to the Health Officer.

2/16/26: Dog Poop/Pee issues

Person #2 ACO Valandingham

I had replied via email and spoke with Person #1. Their neighbors allow their dogs to defecate on her building, sidewalk and an empty lot next to the building. They do not curb and have retractable leashes longer than 6 feet. I advised, without proof, I cannot send summons. However, I will patrol and attempt to obtain evidence. In the meantime, I will find the owners of the neighbors and contact them via mail with the ordinance.

2/16/26: Pet license renewal

I had received an email stating Person#1 had an issue licensing her pet. I advised she go online, login/create an SDL account. If she continues to have an issue, to contact me.

Person #1 had found a stray cat 2/16/26. She took possession of it and is unable to keep it. She is looking for assistance. I had sent lists of rescues/animal welfare groups.

We had spoken of this issue 12/1/26. I had sent a dog temperature chart along with a warning and pet application. The behavior had stopped for awhile but she saw the dog outside barking to come in again. I advised I will follow up. The dog is currently licensed.

I had arrived to Mechanic Street and the amount of urine and feces all over was horrific. I took photos. The suspected offenders live on Mechanic street. I will send a warning. There are additional offenders who live down the block, I generated a letter stating the ordinance and sent it to civilians living near the area in question.

2/18/26: Dog being left outside

After receiving another notice that the dog was outside again, I went to look. The dog was not outside at this time. 15:00; 45 degrees.

2/19/26: Curbing issue

Person #1 ACO Valandingham

I had generated a letter/Warning notice stating the town curbing ordinances and sent them to the properties surrounding Mechanic Street (where the curbing issue is located). A house on Mechanic Street has 2-3 dogs living on the property, zero dogs licensed at this time. These dogs have been seen defecating on the property and seen not picking up after the dogs.

2/19/26: Possible Abandoned Cats

I had received an email stating Person #1 concern about cats possible being abandoned. The care taker had recently passed, possibly leaving behind a personal cat and/or a colony of cats. I had yet to be noticed by the landlord or next of kin. In fear for the safety and care of the cats, I reached out for the address of the decedent and/or next of kin.

I do not have an exact address of where the cats may be located, however I decided to patrol the area. I was UTL any cats at this time. I will follow up with address/ number. In the meantime, I will continue to patrol the area.

I had received a call from dispatch to contact Randolph Animal control in regards to a sick/injured groundhog. While calling, I had received a call from Person #2, who had Person #3 on the line. Person #3 described he knew Person #2, and she told him she found a GH 2/19/26 and has been keeping it in her apartment. I let everyone know that I will take possession of the GH and bring to Person #2 for immediate medical attention. I met Person #1 and she was afraid the GH would be euthanized. I explained to her the protocol and took the GH. I brought to Person #2.

2/21/26: Found Dog

I had received a call from dispatch to contact Person #1 in regards to a found Dog. He said the dog was running in traffic and was able to pick it up and safely place in his car. The dog had a collar, no tag. I went to meet Person #1 to pick up the dog at Fairview/Essex. While I was enroute, Person #1 patrolled the area in search of the owners. He located them and gave the dog back to them. No further action required.

2/24/26: Court: 8/9/25 incident

Person # 1 Liberty Street

Person # 2 Esq.

I had arrived to court. Person #1, Person #2 and myself went to the prosecutor's office where we explained the cost of the tickets. Person #1 agreed to plead guilty. We went into the

court where the Judge made it clear about the severity of the situation, accepted the plea and closed the case.

2/16/26: Invoice review

Person # 2 Animal Hospital

I contacted the AH in regards to the incorrect invoice. I had brought in a stray kitten, 8/30/25 for a 7-day stray hold. Upon arrival a staff member decided to keep it. I told her after the 7-day hold she can take the kitten home. The AH continued to bill us for boarding and medical without contacting me at any point. I did not approve the stay or any medical to be done. This continued until 10/25. In addition, I had asked for an extension in the past, so I may locate a place to bring a dog in lieu of euthanizing a healthy dog, and I was told NO. I am not permitted any extension ever for any animal brought in. If this is in fact the rule, why was it broken and not even approved by me. Alicia said she will get back to me after she follows up with a manager.

2/25/26: Stray Gray Cat

I had received a call from Person #1 regarding concern for a gray cat. Her neighbor/friend had recently passed away and she had been caring for the stray. Person #1 is concerned for the cat's well-being. I offered to lend a trap and assist with the Vetting for the cat. After the cat receives medical, he will be returned to where he was trapped. Person #1 agreed to feed him. He had been inside, but prefers to be an outdoor cat. There are others in the neighborhood who feed and look out for gray the stray.

I had contacted Person #1 in regards the TNR for gray the stray. I advised we wait until next week due to not having an appointment set. I will drop the trap off so she has it and when we have the proper time to trap.

2/26/26: Dog biting inquiry

Person #2 ACO Valandingham

I had spoken with Person #1 in great length in regards to his situation. His dog, who he had rescued over 9 years ago, is guarding his wife and biting him. He is concerned for his safety and was inquiring about muzzle laws and if I was able to make his wife use on their dog. I explained the process of deeming the dog potentially dangerous along with his other options. We spoke about training and medication. The dog had been prescribed Prozac which the wife secretly stopped providing to the dog. They should see their Vet and get the dog on his medication and go from there. I offered a trainer and my services with picking a muzzle and/or speaking directly to his wife. The dog is currently not in Boonton as he does not wish to live with the dog until he feels safe. After our conversation, he said he will think of the information and get back to me if he requires my assistance.

Person #1 had contacted me to let me know that Gray, the Stray, came to eat. She also sent a photo so I know what the cat looks like. I advised she continues to feed until we set the trap.
