December 15, 2025**

The Town Council of the Town of Liberty, Indiana had a regular meeting on December 15, 2025 at the Town Administration building located at 101 Brownsville Avenue.

Mr. Tipton called the meeting to order.

ROLL CALL

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Keasling made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of December 1, 2025. Mr. Jenkins supported the motion. Upon a vote viva voce, motion passed.

Mr. Jenkins made a motion to approve Resolution 2025-18. Mr. Kahl supported the motion. Upon a vote viva voce, motion passed.

Mr. Lang made a motion to approve Resolution 2025-19. Mr. Keasling supported the motion. Upon a vote viva voce, motion passed.

DEPARTMENT HEADS

Police Chief, Todd Dickenson reported that the Forty-hour pre-basic class just wrapped with both officers participating in the class passed.

MISC. BUSINESS

Mr. Jenkins made a motion to the revision of the title and introductory paragraph of the Township Fire Protection agreement as one of the Township Trustees did not like the language. Mr. Lang supported the motion. Upon a vote viva voce, motion passed.

The Neighbor Center Street closure request for a 5K was discussed. There is concern from the Council and the Utilities Superintendent, Matt Reuss regarding the increase of the 5K runs. After the 5k run that just occurred, members of the library did not move the barricade at College Corner Avenue so the street stayed closed until Mr. Reuss moved it at 9:00 p.m. The Council is concerned about completely closing all the street intersections affected by the run. The Council has requested that Mr. Reuss and Chief Dickenson get together and layout a 5k course that would have the least impact on the residents. It was also discussed that the event coordinators provide enough volunteers at the intersections to manage traffic rather than stop it completely. Mr. Keasling made a motion to approve the date requested for the 5k run. Mr. Jenkins supported the motion. Upon a vote viva voce, motion passed.
