- ~~(b) *Composition; appointment.* The architectural review board will consist of three members of the plan commission with two alternates also from the plan commission. These will be appointed by the village president and approved by the village board for a one year term.   - ~~(1) The ARB will review all new dwelling plans and all remodeling plans for the exterior of dwellings which require a building permit.~~

**Sec. 38-503. Plan commission.**

(a) Purpose. The plan commission shall have the powers and duties prescribed in Wis. Stats. § 62.23, and such other powers and duties as shall be vested in the commission from time to time by the village board. In addition to all other powers of the plan commission, the commission shall oversee the functions of the office of the ~~zoning administrator~~ building inspector and review and advise the village board regarding proposed amendments to this chapter and related zoning maps. The Building Inspector will review all minor permits such as for garages, garden sheds, storage buildings, fences, decks and porches which require a building permit. If further clarification is needed the Building Inspector can request additional approval from the Plan Commission.

(c) Principles. To implement and define criteria for the purpose set forth in this article, the following principles are established:

- (1) No building shall be permitted, the design or exterior appearance of which is of unorthodox or abnormal character in relation to its surroundings as to be unsightly or offensive to generally accepted taste and village standards.
- (2) No building shall be permitted, the design or exterior appearance of which is so identical with those adjoining as to create excessive monotony or drabness.

(3) No building shall be permitted where any exposed facade is constructed or faced with a finished material which is aesthetically incompatible with the other facades and which presents an unattractive appearance to the public and to surrounding properties.

**Amending Section 38-35, 38-46(i), 38-48(c)(1-4), 38-68(4)(b), 38-70(4)(b), 38-72(d), 38-74(g-h), 38-96(5), 38-97(5)(a), 38-97(5), 38-98(5), 38-99(7), and 38-100(g-h).**

The Village Board of the Village of Random Lake do ordain as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Chapter 38 Zoning, Section 38-35 entitled “Boundaries” of the Code of the Village of Random Lake is hereby amended with new language underlined and/or deleted language ~~stricken~~ to provide as follows:

**Sec. 38-35. Boundaries.**

When uncertainty exists with respect to the boundaries of the various districts as shown on the map, the following rules shall apply:

- (1) When width or length of boundaries are not clear, the scale of the map shall determine the approximate dimensions.
- (2) If the village's floodplain, shoreland-wetland, and general zoning regulations conflict with one another, the most restrictive combination of such regulations shall control.
- (3) District boundaries are normally lot lines and centerlines of streets, highways, railroads or alleys.
- (4) Prior to obtaining any permits in any zoning district identified above, all plans, to the extent applicable, shall be submitted to the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission in accordance with this article.

**SECTION 2:** Chapter 38 Zoning, Section 38-46 entitled “Fences and Walls”, Subsection 38-46(i) entitled “Appeals” of the Code of the Village of Random Lake is hereby amended with new language underlined and/or deleted language ~~stricken~~ to provide as follows:

- (i) *Appeals.* Any person aggrieved by any decision of the ~~zoning administrator~~, building inspector, or ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission related to architectural control may appeal the decision to the board of appeals. Such appeals shall be filed with the clerk-treasurer within 30 days after filing of the decision of the ~~zoning administrator~~, building inspector, or ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission.

**SECTION 3:** Chapter 38 Zoning, Section 38-48 entitled “Signs”, Subsection 38-48(c) entitled “Permit required” of the Code of the Village of Random Lake is hereby amended with new language underlined and/or deleted language ~~stricken~~ to provide as follows:

- (c) *Permit required.* No property owner shall construct a directional, ground, pole, projecting, or wall sign in the village without first obtaining approval of the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission and a permit from the building inspector.
  - (1) Fee. The permit fees shall be as provided in the village fee schedule.
  - (2) Criteria for assessment. In evaluating any sign application, the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission may make such orders and establish such conditions as may be appropriate to meet the criteria of this section to protect the public health, welfare, safety and natural beauty of the village. The ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission shall consider the following criteria in evaluating an application for a sign permit:
    - a. Appropriateness of the style and dimensions of the sign when viewed in context of the structures existing on the property as well as the size of such structures and the typography and landscaping of the property in general.
    - b. Compatibility of the sign in the context of signs existing in the neighborhood.
    - c. Impact of the sign upon vehicular traffic movement.
    - d. Impact of the sign on property values in the vicinity of the sign.
    - e. Impact of the sign upon the natural beauty and attractiveness of the village.
  - (3) Conditional sign permit. There are certain types of signs which, because of their unique characteristics, cannot be properly classified as unrestricted permitted uses in any districts without consideration, in each case, of the impact of those signs upon neighboring land or public facilities. Such signs, nevertheless, may be necessary or desirable to be allowed in a particular district, provided that due consideration is given to location, size, and design. Such signs are classified as conditional uses and may only be erected following the issuance of a conditional use sign permit. Prior to the granting of any conditional use sign permit, the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission may stipulate such conditions and restrictions upon the establishment, location, size, construction, color, maintenance,

and operation of the sign as deemed necessary to promote the public health, safety and general welfare of the community.

- (4) Appeals. Any person aggrieved by any decision of the ~~zoning administrator~~ Building Inspector or ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission related to architectural control may appeal the decision to the board of appeals. Such appeals shall be filed with the clerk-treasurer within 30 days after filing of the decision of the ~~zoning administrator~~ Building Inspector or ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission.

**SECTION 4:** Chapter 38 Zoning, Section 38-68 entitled “R-1 Single-Family Residential District”, Subsection 38-68(4)(b) of the Code of the Village of Random Lake is hereby amended with new language underlined and/or deleted language ~~stricken~~ to provide as follows:

- (4) *Driveways and driveway curb cuts.*
  - a. All driveways must be hard surfaced and constructed within one year of occupancy. The term "hard surfaced" shall be defined as concrete, asphalt or brick paving. Additionally, a driveway apron, consisting of the first five feet of driveway extending onto the property from a public roadway shall be constructed from concrete, shall be at least six inches thick and shall be constructed with tapered sides. No property shall have more than one driveway.
  - b. Plans for driveways and curb cuts shall be submitted as part of the plot plan for review by the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission. Curb cuts shall be made prior to commencement of any construction. Curb cuts shall be saw cut or full replacement of curb shall be required. No mounding of dirt or gravel in the gutter shall be allowed to provide access to the construction site.

**SECTION 5:** Chapter 38 Zoning, Section 38-70 entitled “R-2 Two-Family Residential District”, Subsection 38-70(4)(b) of the Code of the Village of Random Lake is hereby amended with new language underlined and/or deleted language ~~stricken~~ to provide as follows:

- (4) *Driveways and driveway curb cuts.*
  - a. All driveways must be hard surfaced, and constructed within one year of occupancy. The term "hard surfaced" shall be defined as concrete, asphalt or brick paving. **SECTION 6:** Chapter 38 Zoning, Section 38-72 entitled “R-4 Three-Family or Multifamily Residential District”, Subsection 38-72(d) of the Code of the Village of Random Lake is hereby amended with new language underlined and/or deleted language ~~stricken~~ to provide as follows:

- (d) *Driveways and driveway curb cuts.*
  - (1) All driveways must be hard surfaced, and constructed within one year of occupancy. The term "hard surfaced" shall be defined as concrete, asphalt or brick paving. Additionally, a driveway apron, consisting of the first five feet of driveway extending onto the property from a public roadway, shall be constructed from concrete, shall be at least six inches thick and shall be constructed with tapered sides. Quantity of driveways to be recommended with site plan ~~by the architectural review board~~ and approved by the planning commission.
  - (2) Plans for driveways and curb cuts shall be submitted as part of the plot plan for review by the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission. Curb cuts shall be made prior to commencement of any construction. Curb cuts shall be saw cut or full replacement of curb shall be required. No mounding of dirt or gravel in the gutter or use of temporary planking shall be allowed to provide access to the construction site.

- (g) *Architectural review.* Building plans shall also be submitted to the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission for their review and approval prior to the issuance of a building permit.
- (h) *Commencement of project.*
  - (1) After the village board, upon recommendation of the plan commission, has approved the detailed site plans, construction of private and public amenities may commence in accordance with division 2, article IV of [chapter 32](#).
  - (2) No building permit for residences shall be issued until building plans have been approved by the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission and all applicable fees and assessments required in subsection (m) of this section and [section 32-15](#) have been paid and either all public and private construction has been completed and approved or a developer's agreement,

- (g) *Architectural review.* The ~~architectural review board~~ and plan commission shall review the building plans and provide the developer with a list of changes and additional requirements as it deems appropriate. Upon reaching agreement with the developer, the plan commission shall forward its recommendation to the ~~village board~~ Building Inspector.
  - (1) The plan commission has the authority to approve building plans as a package for the entire development, or review on an individual basis if the developer has not finalized future phase building plans.
- (h) *Commencement of project.*
  - (1) After the ~~village board~~, upon recommendation of the plan commission, where they have ~~has~~ approved the detailed site plans, construction of private and public amenities the applicant may commence in accordance with division 2, article IV of chapter 32.
  - (2) No building permit for commercial shall be issued until building plans have been approved by the ~~architectural review board~~ Plan Commission and all applicable fees and assessments required in subsection (m) of this section and section 32-15 have been paid and either all public and private construction has been completed and approved or a developer's agreement, including a letter of credit, has been approved by the village board. For staged development, such developers' agreements shall provide for the construction of improvements and the use of common areas outside of the subject stage.
  - (3) After the village board, upon the recommendation of the plan commission, has approved the plans, the project shall be commenced within one year unless the time is extended in writing by the village board. In the event the project is not so timely commenced, the approval of the village board shall be deemed to be automatically revoked and zoning will revert back to the classification it held prior to C-PUD overlay district approval.

**SECTION 13:** If any provision of this Ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional or if the application of this Ordinance to any person or circumstance is found invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the provision or application of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the valid or unconstitutional provision or application.

**SECTION 14:** All ordinances and/or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 15:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of adoption and notice to the public as required by law.

**SECTION 16:** Village personnel are hereby authorized and directed to make all changes to the Village Code necessary to reflect this amendment.

### REMINDERS FOR FEBRUARY:

**NO FEBRUARY PRIMARY ELECTION** - In Random Lake there are no offices that require a primary for the April election. Therefore, there will not be an election held February 17th, so we will see you April 7th for the Spring Election.

**PREPARATIONS FOR 2026 BUILDING PROJECTS** - Late in 2025 the village converted to an online permitting system to help with the record keeping of building permits. No paper applications will be accepted and all submission will be directed to the village website. On the main page there is a quick link "Building Permits" that will take you directly to the application website for submittal of your projects permit.

#### **Annual Boat Launch Passes and Park Area Rental applications available**

Annual Season Boat Launch Passes are now available for purchase at Village Hall. Costs: Resident is \$50 and Non-Resident is \$80.

- Tent/Bounce House placement in any parks - \$100 (\$50 cleaning deposit included in rental fee to be returned after rental)

## Village Board Agenda Requests – How to Get an Item Discussed

Do you have a topic you care about and want the Village Board to discuss it? We encourage resident input — and the best way to create real progress is to request an agenda item **ahead of the meeting**.

A quick note about **Public Comment** during Village Board Meetings: Wisconsin law allows the public to speak during public comment, but the Board is **not able to engage in back-and-forth discussion** or provide detailed responses during that portion of the meeting. Public comment is intended for residents to share feedback, not for discussion or decision-making.

If you want the Board to actually discuss your topic, ask questions, and potentially take action, the best approach is to submit your request to be placed on an upcoming agenda. To help the Board have a productive discussion, please include:

- a short written description of the issue
- what outcome you’re requesting
- any helpful documentation (photos, links, examples, etc.)
- ideally, also include proposed solution options that we can iterate on together



When items are submitted with clear information, the Board can review it in advance and have a more efficient and productive meeting for everyone. Our goal is always productive meetings that lead to progress — and prepared agenda submissions help make that possible. Thank you for helping us respect the time of residents, staff, and board members while continuing to improve Random Lake.

## Types of Alerts/Notifications Services

The village currently uses two types of alert/notification systems dependent upon the context of the information to be sent out.

Through the village website you can sign up to receive notifications for upcoming meeting or news flashes (garbage delay, holiday closures, etc.). To sign up go to the village website [randomlakewi.com](http://randomlakewi.com), select “Subscribe” on the top right of the menu bar, and follow the sign up instructions.

Through the Sheboygan County Emergency Management you can sign up for emergency alerts and news flashes happening not just in Random Lake but across the county. To sign up follow the instruction on the photo to the right.

### Reminders

Just a reminder that this utility billing includes the two-weeks span of the holidays. With both Christmas and New Year there may have been the potential of more bodies in your home during that timeframe. This does not always mean you had guests over. This can mean you, as the primary user, were home more days of the week than normal.

The average user uses around 50-100 gallons per day. This can be higher or lower depending on how often you shower, use the toilet, wash your hands or dishes, etc.

So even just one extra day of being home can change your total usage for the month. Please keep that in mind if your usage is a bit higher this billing as it usually is for the January billing every year.

#### **It's a Toilet, not a Trashcan - What not to Flush:**

People sometimes view the toilet as an auxiliary wastebasket. Unfortunately, many of the items that end up in the toilet can cause significant clogging problems, not only in your home's plumbing but, also for the Village's sewer system and Wastewater Treatment Plant.
