I had received an email stating a deceased chicken was in the road. I arrived to the above location and picked up. I disposed. I checked social media to see if anyone reported a missing chicken, no posts and no phone calls.

1/16/26: Poisoned Deceased Cat

I arrived to the above location and met Person #1. She showed me the cat. Her concern, of the deceased cat, is someone may have been poisoned her. I examined the body. Without a necropsy/toxicology report, I was unable to determine cause of death. The cat was an adult, female, gray, DSH, ear tipped, no chip and no collar. I took possession of the body. I checked social media to see if there have been any missing cat posts matching her description. None at this time. I will continue to patrol the area and look out for missing cat posts.

1/20/26: Poisoned Deceased Cat follow up

Out of concern for the safety of the cats/wildlife in the area, in regards to the possible poisoning, I patrolled the area of Liberty Street. I would like to keep my presence known in hopes no foul play will occur.

I had met Person #1 and took possession of the very sick cat. Black, female, underweight, matted, no chip, no collar and no ear tip. The Vet of record was unable to admit the cat. I attempted several different Vets and rehabbers in search for help. No one would see her without a contract or money up front. I spoke with Person #4 in great length and we decided I will take the cat home until I can get an appointment. I wrapped it in a blanket. Provided her with water and kept her in my house in a carrier (suffering).

### Kinnelon

Garden Place - A complaint was received regarding the property at Garden Place, Kinnelon Ridge, The tenants reported a fire in the bathroom on December 1st, allegedly caused by the exhaust fan. As a result of the fire, the sprinkler system activated, causing water damage within the unit. According to the information provided, the unit was cleaned and repaired following the incident. However, the tenants have expressed concerns that the work may not have been appropriately completed and are worried about the potential presence of mold resulting from the water damage. The unit's condition and the adequacy of the repairs have not been verified. (Ongoing)

### Pequannock

Route 23 - No heat in the pool area of the gym facility. No further contact from complainant and facility is making repairs as needed. 01/20/26 Contacted complainant, no answer, left message. (Abated)

Chanos Restaurant - A customer reported finding a piece of metal in their food. The complainant provided photographs of the metal via email, which was identified as coming from a metal mesh sponge used to clean the griddle. An inspection of the establishment was conducted on January 7, 2026. During this inspection, I spoke with the manager, who confirmed that all metal mesh sponges had been discarded and replaced with new, non-metal sponges. She assured me that metal sponges are no longer used in the establishment. (Abated)

Cherries Sports Bar & Grill - Customer complained about sanitation issues. An inspection was conducted, and no violations were observed. (Unconfirmed)

Canacopia - Complaint received about the establishment selling adulterated foods. An inspection was conducted, and all foods were labeled and contained ingredients approved by the FDA. (Unconfirmed)

### Riverdale

Hamburg Turnpike - E-Mail & Voicemail Received 1/9/26 regarding the state of an apartment.

Riverdale stated no CCO for the apartment making it illegal. Complainant was advised to contact tenant/landlord court to see options.
