RUSTIC CT - Trash found on neighboring properties at Rustic Ct. Complainant stated trash being seen is medical waste that is coming from a state approved nursing home located at 1 Rustic Ct. Only trash observed were used rubber gloves. I contacted the rehab center that is affiliated with this nursing facility and I was able to get into contact with the manager of that site. She stated the trash is always kept in trash can with lids this incident occurred due to high winds that pushed the trash can over. When speaking with the manager she stated they do not do anything that produces medical grade waste they only care for disabled patients. The manager did state they do have a medical waste company that is hired by the company but only regular trash is produced at this facility. I sent a NOV 1/2/26 to ensure the facility knows to keep trash neat and in a trash can with tight fitting lids. Explained to the complainant we would speak with them and the trash being produced is no medical grade and can be disposed of in regular trash. It was explained to manager is issue keeps arising summons may be issued. Violation ongoing. Referred complainant to state website regarding medical waste. He contacted the state and they will take over investigation and enforcement. (Abated).

### Pequannock

The Malon Resort 175 Park Ave.: Anonymous complaint received about bathing area that was not approved by the building department. Referred to the building department, fire department, and the NJ Department of Housing. (Ongoing)

N Route 23 - No heat in apartment on site. Inspected apartment found heat to be 57 degrees below the 68 degrees required. Apartment turned out to be an illegal apartment no residential living space is to be on the property zoning was notified.
