ORDINANCE NO. 2026-XX-XXXX

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE VII OF CHAPTER 23 OF THE GLENCOE
VILLAGE CODE REGARDING PARKING REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, the Village of Glencoe is a home rule municipal corporation pursuant to Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs including, but not limited to, the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Article VII of Chapter 23 of the Glencoe Village Code ("**Village Code**") regulates stopping, standing, and parking of vehicles on public roads, streets, and alleys the Village and establishes penalties for violations; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to amend Section 23-84 and Section 23-93.4 of the Village Code to clarify existing regulations and raise penalties for violating certain parking regulations ("**Amendments**"); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the best interests of the Village and its residents will be served by adopting the Amendments as hereinafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF GLENCOE, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION ONE: RECITALS. The foregoing recitals are incorporated in, and made a part of, this Ordinance by this reference as findings of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Glencoe.

SECTION TWO: AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VII OF CHAPTER 23 OF THE VILLAGE CODE. Article VII, entitled "Stopping, Standing and Parking," of Chapter 23, entitled "Motor Vehicles and Traffic," of the Village Code shall be and is hereby amended as set forth in **Exhibit A** attached to and, by this reference, made a part of, this Ordinance.

SECTION THREE: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and

effect ten days after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.

EXHIBIT A

AMENDMENTS

ARTICLE VII. STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING

§ 23-84 MANNER OF PARKING.

(a) Every vehicle stopped or parked upon a roadway where there is an adjacent curb shall be so stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels of such vehicle aligned parallel with and within 12 inches of the right-hand curb, except for angle parking. If a roadway is marked with designated parking space for an individual vehicle, the vehicle must be parked completely within the marked space. Roadways with an adjacent painted curb indicate that parking is prohibited adjacent to that curb. No vehicle may be parked wholly or in part upon a roadway adjacent to a painted curb.

(b) Upon those streets which have been marked or signed for angle parking, vehicles shall be parked at the angle to the curb indicated by such marks or signs, with the nearest corner of the vehicle positioned within 12 inches of the curb. If a roadway is marked with designated parking space for an individual vehicle, that vehicle must be parked completely within the marked space.

~~§ 23-84.1 PARKING ON SIDEWALKS, PARKWAYS AND DRIVEWAY APRONS.~~

~~No person shall park any vehicle on any portion of a parkway, including sidewalks and driveway aprons. Driveway aprons are defined as that portion of a parkway connecting a private driveway and an improved roadway. Notwithstanding the foregoing, persons may park vehicles classified as first division vehicles pursuant to § 23-67 of this code on driveway aprons serving their own residence or residences that they are visiting.~~

STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING PROHIBITED IN SPECIFIED PLACES.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic-control device, no person may:

1. Stop, stand or park a vehicle:

a. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;

b. On a sidewalk;

c. any portion of a driveway apron, defined as that portion of a parkway connecting a private driveway and an improved roadway;

c. Within an intersection;

d. On a crosswalk;

e. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by signs or markings;

f. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;

g. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a highway or within a highway tunnel;

h. On any railroad tracks. A violation of any part of this subparagraph h. shall result in a mandatory fine set forth in the Comprehensive Fee and Fine Schedule or 50 hours of community service.

i. At any place where official signs prohibit stopping;

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j. On any controlled-access highway;

k. In the area between roadways of a divided highway, including crossovers; or

l. In a public parking area if the vehicle does not display a current annual registration sticker or digital registration sticker or current temporary permit pending registration.

2. Stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers:

a. In front of a public or private driveway;

b. Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;

c. Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;

d. Within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway;

e. Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within 75 feet of such entrance (when properly sign-posted); or

f. At any place where official signs prohibit standing.

3. Park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading property or passengers:

a. Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing;

b. At any place where official signs prohibit parking.

(b) No person may move a vehicle not lawfully under his control into any such prohibited area or away from a curb such distance as is unlawful.

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§ 23-93.4 VIOLATIONS OF THIS ARTICLE - PENALTIES.

Any person who shall violate violates any of the provisions of this article shall be fined for each offense in the amount set forth in the village's Comprehensive Fee and Fine Schedule. Unless the person subject to a fine timely requests a hearing on the citation, any citation not paid within ten days is subject to double pursuant to the village's Comprehensive Fee and Fine Schedule.

§ 23-93.5 ENHANCED PENALTIES FOR HIGH DEMAND PARKING AREAS.

(a) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this article in the following locations, between May 1 and October 31 of each year, shall be fined for each offense double the amount set forth in the village's Comprehensive Fee and Fine Schedule, subject to additional penalties for late payment:

1. Sheridan Road from Beach Road to Hawthorn Avenue; Longwood Avenue;

2. Hawthorne Avenue from Sheridan Road to Longwood Avenue;
3. Hazel Avenue from Sheridan Road to street end; Park Avenue from Sheridan Road to street end; and
4. Beach Road from Sheridan Road to street end; Lakefront Park; Glencoe Beach.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 23.86.1b, any person who violates the provisions of section 23-86.1 of this code within the following locations shall be fined at the maximum penalty of \$350 for each offense:

1. Sheridan Road from Beach Road to Hawthorn Avenue; Longwood Avenue;
2. Hawthorne Avenue from Sheridan Road to Longwood Avenue;
3. Hazel Avenue from Sheridan Road to street end; Park Avenue from Sheridan Road to street end; and
4. Beach Road from Sheridan Road to street end; Lakefront Park; Glencoe Beach.

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
