**An Ordinance Adding the Definition of Battery Energy Storage System to Section 264-2 of the Schenectady Zoning Code and Amending Schedule B of Chapter 264 of the Zoning Code to Allow Battery Energy Storage Systems per Specified Standards.**

The Council of the City of Schenectady in regular meeting ordains as follows:

**Section 1. Purpose.** The City of Schenectady Zoning Code, Chapter 264, needs to be updated to include the developing technology of Battery Energy Storage Systems.

**Section 2.** Section 264-2 is to be amended to add the following definition:

**BATTERY ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEM**—One or more devices, assembled together, capable of storing energy in order to supply electrical energy at a future time, not to include a stand-alone 12-volt car battery or an electric motor vehicle, or as defined by the New York State Energy Development Authority (NYSERDA). A Battery Energy storage system is classified as a Tier 1 or Tier 2 Battery Energy Storage System as follows:

- A. Tier 1 B Battery Energy Storage Systems have an aggregate energy capacity less than or equal to 600kWh, and, if in a room or enclosed area, consist of only a single energy storage system technology. This definition is intended to mirror the NYSERDA definition for Tier 1 Battery Energy Storage Systems and will change to conform with any future NYSERDA definition changes.
- B. Tier 2 Battery Energy Storage Systems have an aggregate energy capacity greater than 600kWh or are comprised of more than one storage technology in a room or in enclosed or exterior area. This definition is intended to mirror the NYSERDA definition for Tier 2 Battery Energy Storage Systems and will change to conform with any future NYSERDA definition changes.

**Section 3.** Schedule B, Attachment 2, of Chapter 264 is amended to add to the Table of Uses for Non-Residential Districts: Tier 1 Battery Energy Storage Facilities, in all residential, commercial and industrial zoning districts subject to a building permit. Tier 2 Battery Energy Storage Facilities, in the C-5, M-1 and M-2 Districts by Special Use Permit with a reference note to the NYSERDA standards for such facilities. Special Use Permit application must be in conformance with current NYSERDA standards.

**Section 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.

**An Ordinance to Amend Section 9-6 of the Schenectady City Code to Increase the Membership of the Downtown Schenectady Improvement Corporation (DSIC) Board from No Less Than Nine to no more than Fifteen Members and to Amend Such Membership Qualifications.**

The Council of the City of Schenectady in regular meeting convened, ordains as follows.

**Section 1. Purpose: To increase the number of board members of the Downtown Schenectady Improvement Corporation from no less than nine to no more than fifteen members and to amend the qualifications of membership of the Downtown Special Assessment District to conform with New York State Chapter Law 505 of the Laws of 2024.**

**Section 2. Section 9-6 of Chapter 9 of the Schenectady City Code is amended as follows:**

**Section 9-6 Operations and Development Committee.**

**A.** In order to ensure the active participation of property owners within the district, there is established a Downtown Special Assessment District Operations and Development Committee, also to be known as the "[Downtown Special Assessment District Board]," **Downtown Schenectady Improvement Corporation (DSIC)** consisting of **no less than nine members and no more than fifteen members** with staggered terms of three years. At least **seven members of the Committee must be owners of assessable property within the district, or the agents of such owners.** **three-quarters of the then current complement of committee members shall be owners of assessable real property within the special assessment district, or agents of such owners.** The Mayor shall appoint the members of the Committee with the consent of the City Council. In appointing members representing property owners, the Mayor shall give due regard to representation throughout the district. At the time of appointment of the first Committee, the Mayor shall designate which three members serve for one year, which three for two years and which for three years. A vacancy is to be filled in the same manner for the unexpired term

**Section 3.** This Ordinance Amendment shall take effect immediately.

**WHEREAS**, municipal corporations are authorized to enter into cooperative agreements under Article 5-G of General Municipal Law, subject to approval by the local legislative body; and

**WHEREAS**, the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (hereinafter DCJS) is providing funding to support local enforcement agencies with expenditures related to the implementation of the New York State Discovery and Bail reforms during the period of 2023-2024; and

**WHEREAS**, DCJS set a maximum award for each County that was determined based on each county's prorated share of criminal court arraignments statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, Schenectady County submitted a 2023-2024 Discovery Reform Funding Plan which was approved by DCJS; and

**WHEREAS**, Schenectady County desires to disburse said funds to various local police agencies in the County including the Schenectady Police Department; and

**WHEREAS**, Schenectady County, through the County Finance Department, shall distribute funds in the amount of \$85,000.00 to the Schenectady Police Department; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT, RESOLVED**, that the Mayor is authorized to enter into the intermunicipal cooperative agreement, regarding the distribution of DCJS Discovery Reform Funds with Schenectady County, subject to the review and approval of the Corporation Counsel as to form and content thereof.
