

Wynnedale Town Council

Minutes

Jan. 11, 2022

The meeting was held via Zoom and called to order at 7:00 p.m. Present were Mary Beth Schneider, Ann Hildner, Andrew Hawickhorst, Sue Rice and Jarnell Burks-Craig

Minutes of November meeting and December's emergency snowplow meeting were reviewed and approved. November minutes were amended to reflect that the paperwork for the addition of three new lights for the north side of Wynnedale was completed. The town will bear no cost for the installation, though the monthly bill will increase.

Jarnell gave the treasurer's report, reflecting a bank balance as of Dec. 31 of \$32,815.19. Combined with the money market funds, the total balance as of Dec. 31 was \$133,193.82.

Old business:

Snow plower Scott Moore had not yet contacted Jarnell for the needed information, but Sue Rice had been in contact with him and all seemed set.

Concerns remain about speeding on Cold Spring Road, which is controlled by the City of Indianapolis and not the Town of Wynnedale. Ann Hildner was in contact with the chief engineer for the city's Department of Public Works and Jill Palmer, the traffic engineer, and was meeting with them about steps that might be taken to slow motorists, who have damaged mailboxes and property of Wynnedale homeowners along that road.

New business:

The council discussed the recent incident in which a dog owned by Janet Gibson was killed by a dog at 2157 Wilshire Road. That property does have electric fences. Indianapolis animal control had been notified.
